The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC **anticipates** funds from the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (DJJDP) in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2010-2011** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2010**. The use of DJJDP funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed Programs:

<b>Restitution - Community Service</b>	<b>Psychological Assessments/Testing</b>
<b>Family Counseling w/ Parent/Family Skills</b>	<b>Substance Abuse Assessment &amp; Treatment</b>
<b>Classes</b>	<b>Emergency Shelter Services</b>

Proposed Program Services should target the following Risk Factors for Delinquency or Repeat Delinquency:

**Adjudicated youth with: peer relationship issues or associate with delinquent youth, have moderate to serious school behavior problems, some substance use or abuse and are in need of further assessment or treatment, have had prior adjudications and have parents who have problems with providing adequate levels of supervision.**

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for Adjudicated Youth:

Peer Domain:	<b>Adjudicated youth who sometimes associate with delinquent youth.</b>
Individual Domain:	<b>Adjudicated youth who are in need of more mental health assessment and treatment.</b>
Family Domain:	<b>Adjudicated youth who have parents who have marginal parenting skills and are in need of parent/family supervision skills classes and family counseling.</b>
School Domain:	<b>Adjudicated youth who have multiple unexcused absences, short or long term suspensions, who are expelled or have school disciplinary problems.</b>

Applicants are being sought that are able to address the legislatively mandated items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that is shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
5. Programs that can have a demonstrable impact on the following success factors: a. reduce the use of alcohol or controlled substances; b. reduce subsequent complaints; c. reduce violation of terms of community supervision; d. reduce convictions from subsequent offenses; e. fulfill restitution to victims; and f. increase parental accountability.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) **non-profit** corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications (Program Agreements) for programs addressing the above elements. Application forms and other necessary information may be obtained from:
